5. **Following Directions**: Engage them in simple recipes or crafts, emphasizing the importance of following step-by-step instructions.




6. **Greeting Others**: Encourage them to greet family members or neighbors with a smile and a simple "hello," fostering social skills and politeness.


ENGLISH CONVERSATION:

- Write 5 words of each word family at, an, ap, ad, ag, ab and am in 4 lines rough notebook.


